Introduction

Adjunct Professors Policy

An adjunct professor is an individual external the First Nations University of Canada (FNUniv) who has been identified as having a particular contribution to make to the teaching or research mandate of the university. This is an honorary position, and FNUniv assumes no financial obligation to individuals appointed within the guidelines of this policy. Adjunct Professors have no voting privileges within FNUniv's Academic Council and Program Councils.

Adjunct Professors are recognized for demonstrated expertise in subject areas pertaining to the programs to which they have been appointed. They must be active researchers and/or teachers and normally will have a PhD or equivalent. Candidates are nominated by the program area and are appointed by the Vice-President Academic of FNUniv. Nominations must be accompanied by:

- a memo to the VP Academic explaining the reasons for the nomination
- an up-to-date CV

The appointment form will specify a term, normally three to five years. Program areas may apply for renewals.
