

## In-School Administration Leadership Opportunities for Indigenous Candidates

D. Feehan Catholic High School, as well as a nationally recognized social pediatrics program at St. Mary's Wellness and Education Centre.

Applications for the positions of Elementary Principals, Vice Principals and High School Vice Principals are invited from Indigenous candidates, with duties commencing at the start of the 2022-2023 school year. Assignments will include choice placements at Indigenous and community schools in Saskatoon. These leadership positions will provide an exciting challenge for candidates who possess strong administrative, human relations, communication, curriculum and instruction skills.

## Individuals applying for these roles should possess the following:

- Strong knowledge and experience integrating instructional leadership principles
- Understanding and experience with community integration
- Demonstrated improvement of student learning outcomes
- Extensive knowledge of strategies to support the retention and success of Indigenous students
- Commitment to the ideals and principles of Catholic Education

## Preference may be given to applicants who possess:

- A post-graduate degree in education
- Competency in an Indigenous language
