

# INDIGENOUS EDUCATION CRITERIA FOR ACCEPTANCE

- Applicants must be admitted to the University of Regina, Enrollment Services (Admissions). All prospective applicants who wish to enrol in the Indigenous Education programs must submit an application that will be forwarded to the Indigenous Education Admission's Committee. Applicants will be informed if they will be invited for an interview into the Indigenous Education program of their choice. The following programs are available:
  - Bachelor of Indigenous Education-Elementary Program (BIEDE)
  - Bachelor of Education After Degree Elementary Program (BIEADE)
  - Bachelor of Indigenous Education-Secondary Program (BIEDS)
  - Bachelor of Indigenous Education After Degree-Secondary Program (BIEADS)
  - First Nations Language Instructors' Certificate (no interview required)
  - Certificate of Extended Studies in Aboriginal Education (no interview required)

Students who are accepted for the winter semester may take Arts/Science courses that may go towards their Programs but will not be interviewed until the following interview period.

- 2. Current University of Regina, or other affiliated colleges', students who wish to enter the Indigenous Education Faculty must be interviewed and accepted prior to completing a Faculty Transfer Form.
- 3. Mature Admission students wishing to enrol in Indigenous Education Programs are eligible to apply (*please see U of R online Undergraduate Calendar, Pg. 19*)
- 4. Please note the following differences in application procedures for the Elementary and the Secondary programs.

# ELEMENTARY/SECONDARY PROGRAM APPLICATION PROCEDURE

1. The deadline for fall applications are as follows:

March 31 June 30 September 30 (BIEAD ONLY)

- Students will be contacted by telephone to arrange an interview. The FIRST intake interview will take place by APRIL 30. The SECOND intake interview will take place by JULY 31.
   Interviews for the January intake shall be completed by October 31.
- 3. The Bachelor of Indigenous Education Elementary After Degree program begins every **JANUARY**.
- 4. Students are encouraged to register for arts/science courses until they are accepted into the **BIED** program. Bachelor of Indigenous Education After Degree applicants may register for courses after they are accepted in the **BIEAD** program. Applicants should arrange to see an Academic Advisor. Appointments can be made by calling (306) 790-5950 ext. 3001 or (306) 765-3333 ext.7501.

### SECONDARY PROGRAM APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Secondary students require a major and a minor in their education degree. Indigenous Education offers an Education major or minor in Indigenous Studies. Other Education majors and minors are chosen from those available through the Faculty of Education, University of Regina. Students who select a major other than Indigenous Studies must meet the requirements of their selected discipline prior to acceptance into the Secondary Program.

**EARLY APPLICATION IS ADVISED.** Students planning to enter the BEAD Secondary program may need to take prerequisite courses required for their major and minor choices. Especially if they hold a three-year degree. Students are advised to see an Academic Advisor regarding prerequisites prior to registration in classes. Appointments can be made by calling Regina (306) 790-5950 ext. 3001 or Prince Albert (306) 765-3333 ext. 7501.

## **GENERAL APPLICATION GUIDELINES FOR ALL STUDENTS**

- 1. Students should leave an **ACTIVE TELEPHONE NUMBER** where they can be contacted to set up an interview. The Interview Committee consists of two Indigenous Education faculty members, an Elder and/or Academic Advisor.
- Out-of-province students may be interviewed by telephone conference call. Indigenous Education committee <u>reserves the right to refuse admission even when the stated</u> <u>requirements for entrance have been satisfied.</u>

The Indigenous Education Admission Committee bases the interview and acceptance on the following criteria:

- 1. Grade Point Average
  - A) Mature Admission (please see U of R online Undergraduate Calendar, Pg. 19)
  - B) Transfer students from other faculties including
    - i. Prospective BIEAD Students
      - Degree in acceptable major and minor 65% average
  - C) Secondary students 70% in major and 65% overall
- 2. Information submitted on the application form
- 3. Information presented during the interview
- 4. Professional Performance Experience Students who have been discontinued from any other program are not normally allowed to apply into the First Nations University of Canada Indigenous Education Program for a period of at least one year.
- 5. Information forwarded by the references
