

Winter 2022 Term Vaccination Declaration

November 23, 2021

A reminder to all FNUniv Students of the Regina, Saskatoon and Northern Campus, you are **mandated by the University of Regina to declare your proof of vaccination by December 1, 2021.** Students who have submitted their proof of double vaccination during the Fall term and received confirmation of a successful declaration are not required to resubmit.

FNUniv Students **must declare** their status by accessing their account on **UR Self-Service**.

- If, for any reason, you are unable to complete the Declaration, please contact Ask.Us@uregina.ca.

Whether or not you plan to be on campus for any reason during the Winter term, you must complete the Vaccination Declaration through the University of Regina. You will not be allowed on any campus until the Declaration is received. **It is your responsibility to check UR Self-Service.**

Rapid Antigen Testing

The procedure will be similar to Fall 2021. Students who are not fully vaccinated or choose not to disclose their vaccination status will be required to undergo regular, rapid antigen testing and receive ongoing negative test results to attend any campus in person.

Effective January 2, 2022, Students who are not fully vaccinated or choose not to disclose their vaccination status **at any of the three campus locations will be required to undergo regular rapid antigen testing, three times per week on their own time, at their own expense and upload the results in UR Self-Service.**
